	Site Plan for Student Achievement – SPSA: SSC had reviewed & approved the preliminary SPSA (in Word Doc format) during the previous meeting to submit to the District Board before Winter break. Dr. Emery reviewed the organization of the SPSA within the actual State template. Goals and data were reviewed once again. SSC and Staff were used specific data to set goals. Specific actions and strategies are connected to each goal. New goals are created each year based on latest data. Funds are identified and allocated to support & implement the strategies and action plans for achieving each goal. Our overarching goals is to show measurable & consistent growth in all students. Because of Distance Learning, our measures are limited to the agreed upon District Local Measures and site progress monitoring procedures.	AI Motion: KR Second: AW
	Safe School Plan Dr. Emery shared the Comprehensive Safe School Plan in Word Doc form with SSC. Several sections remain almost unchanged as they apply to Normal Schooling times and will mostly apply again for the new 2021-2022 school-year. They were reviewed briefly. Dr. Emery reviewed what kinds of emergencies and hazards the school needs to plan for: Natural Disasters and Human-Made Disasters. Dr. Emery explained that we plan for disasters and hazards by working in planning teams and School then the Safety Committee reviews the input to draft/revise the actual annual plan. It is then brought to the SSC for approval and sent to the District for further approval. Part of school safety plan includes doing vulnerability and hazard assessments which is almost moot during Distance Learning. The Comprehensive School Safety Plan is developed and kept in a State template format. Return to School Plan. Dr. Emery explained the sections describing our school and District’s plan to bring students physically back to school in more detail. Key features include a Hybrid Model of student learning. 	<p>time working from home. There will be AM and PM cohorts (small groups of students) limited to space available keeping with 6ft. of physical distancing. Hybrid model is not set to begin until the County enters the "Red" Tier, currently in Purple. Hybrid model will require the implementation of the Core FOUR: 1) Health Screening, 2) Mask Wearing, 3) Physical Distancing, 4) Hand Washing. Details of Plan are still being worked out with the site's Safety Committee. Ms. Camp asked for clarification about how teachers will get their State entitled break time. The question was asked about how teachers feel about returning to teach in person. Ms. Camp expressed her opinion about the comfort level depending on teachers getting vaccinated. Other teachers on SSC agreed. Ms. Ward asked if the results of the parent survey about students returning to school would be shared. Dr. Emery shared that 75% of the parents that had already responded were opting to send kids back to school in-person. Approx. 25% want to remain in Distance Learning. The office staff would be following up for more responses next week. Dr. Emery said she feels encouraged that things are moving in a promising direction as vaccines begin to spread among adults. Many questions are still unanswered about how we will return, but it is an on-going process. We do know that there will not be recess or lunchtimes at school in order to minimize opportunity for cross contact among students. An Ingress and Egress plan was reviewed. Many of the details depends on numbers of students returning. Three parents suggested that Ingress should be based on last name basis to keep families together. Suggestion was made to do health screening in cars. Those options will be explored by the Safety Committee next week and then by the site staff as well. Mr. Ellis asked if COVID vaccines would be mandatory for teachers. Dr. Emery said they would not be mandatory but encouraged.</p> <p>The Comprehensive Safe School Plan was approved and will be sent to the District office. The Hybrid Model safety procedures will still be evolving and reviewed by all.</p>
